### **QUESTION ONE**

Your club likes as many boards as possible to be played in a daytime session, up to a maximum of 36. What movement would you use for the following number of tables **and** how many boards will be played? (Give separate numbers for NS and EW should they be different.)

Name **one only** movement for each number of tables.

(a) 9 tables

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(b) 11½ tables

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(c) 10 tables

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(d) 4 tables

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(e) 13½ tables

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**QUESTION TWO**

The first round of a session has started when another pair arrives. Club policy is to make them welcome. What changes would you make had you started with each of the following movements? The maximum number of boards to be played in each situation is given in brackets.

(a) 10 Skip Mitchell; 4 boards per round (Max 36 Boards)

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(b) 5 Table Howell (Max.27 Boards)

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(c) 12½ tables set up as a Share & Relay Mitchell with a NS Rover; 3 boards per round (Max. 36)

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(d) 10½ tables set up as a 1½ Appendix Mitchell; 3 boards per round (30)

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**QUESTION THREE**

You have added a NS Rover to a 9 table Mitchell movement.

(a) Give the order of tables at which the NS10 pair will play after sitting out for the first round.

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(b) What adjustments need to be made in the way other pairs move so that no pairs play against the each other twice?

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**QUESTION FOUR**

You will be directing a 2 week matchpointed pairs competition over two sessions. A single winning pair is to be found. 36 pairs have entered so you will run 2 sections of 9 tables each in a completed Mitchell Movement.

(a) Describe your draw for Session 1?

**QUESTION SEVEN**

A session at your club was playing a Share & Relay Mitchell Movement for 11½ tables, 3 boards per round with an EW sit out, when it had to be curtailed by one round. Explain what factors need to be taken into consideration when scoring.

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**QUESTION EIGHT**

For a two session pairs event you start with 9½ tables for the first session. You run a Share & Relay Movement, 3 boards per round with an EW sit out. For the second session one pair does not turn up. You move a few pairs from EW to NS and vice versa while being careful to keep the two fields the same strength. You run a Mitchell Movement, 3 boards per round. Explain what factoring is necessary before the scores from each session may be added together to obtain a single winning pair.

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**QUESTION NINE**

You are running a two session competition to find a single winning pair. For the first week, you have two sections. One section has 9 tables and they play a Mitchell Movement of nine 4 board rounds. The other section has 8½ tables. It also plays nine 4 board rounds but there is an EW sit out. What factoring is necessary before scores from the two sections may be compared with each other?

Show the starting positions of players and boards for a 8 table  $\frac{3}{4}$  Howell movement. Nine 4 board rounds are to be played. Show how players will move after each round and draw arrows to show how boards will be moved.
