Plan a two day pairs congress for 31½ tables.

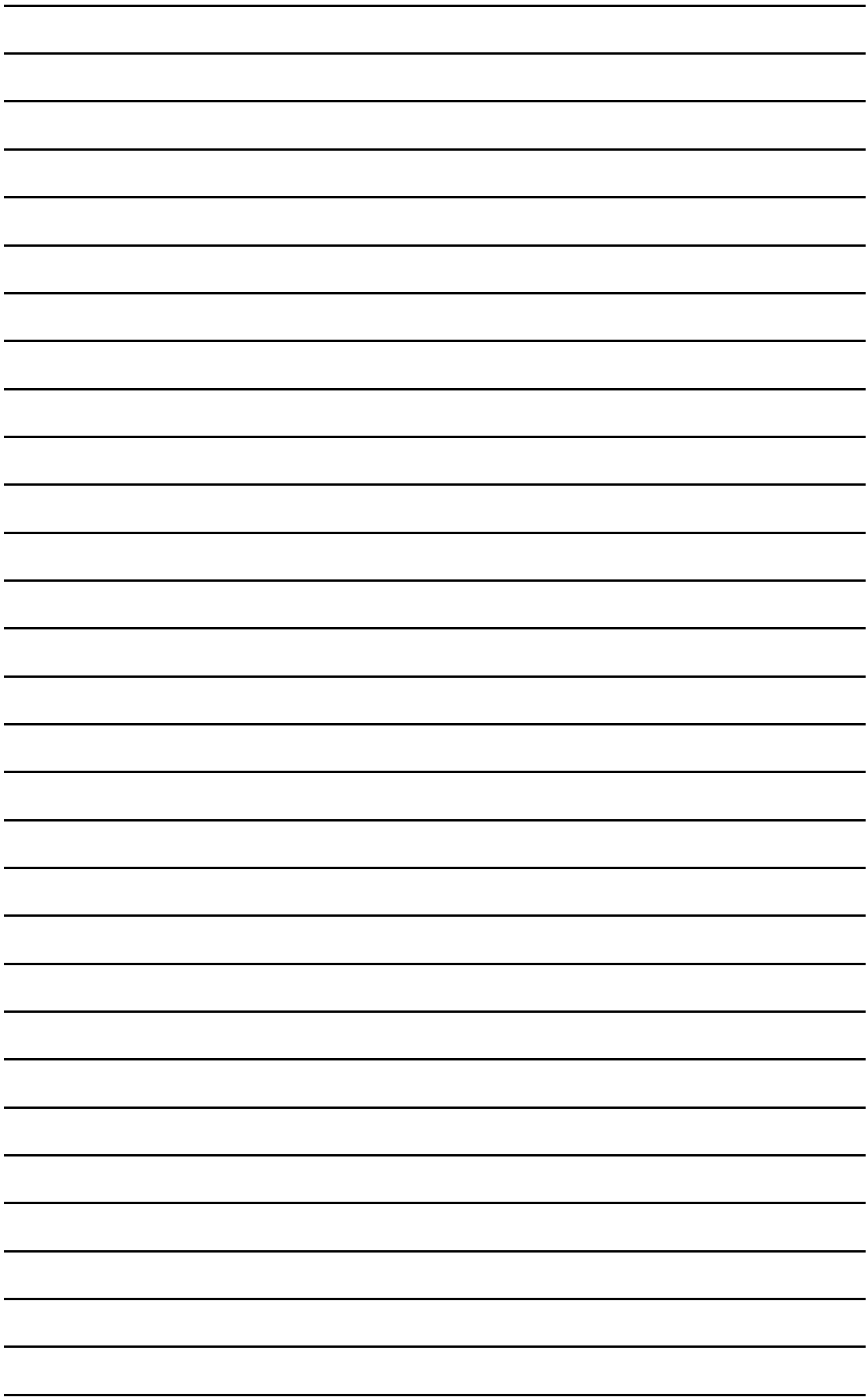
2 qualifying sessions and 2 sessions of barometer finals have been advertised.

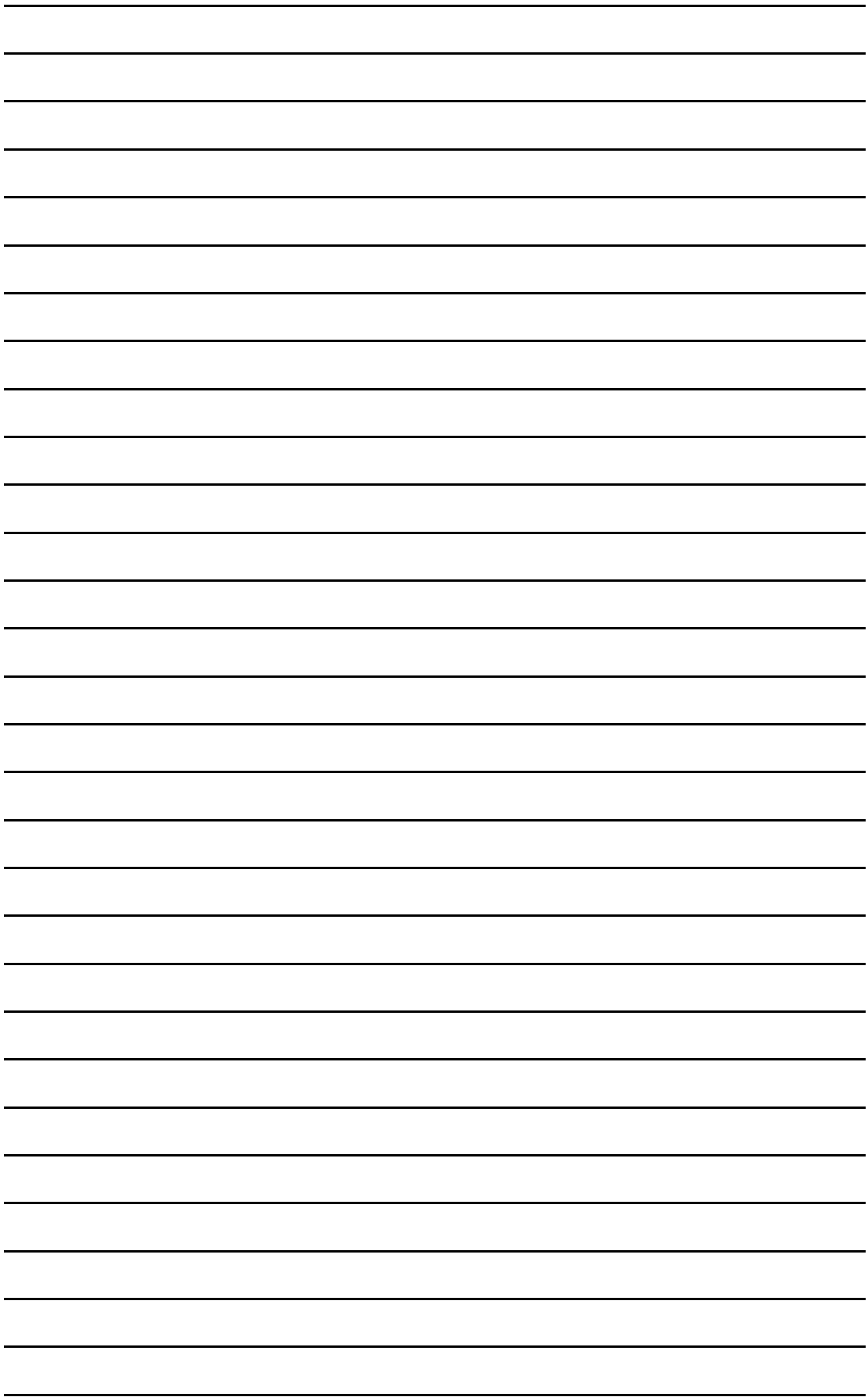
Players expect to play between 50 and 60 boards per day. 2 board rounds are very unpopular.

## QUESTION FIVE

After the qualifying rounds of a pairs event, 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> NS and EW from each section are to go into the final plus the best 3<sup>rd</sup> NS and best 3<sup>rd</sup> EW. Three sections of Mitchell movements have been used for qualifying. Factoring has been done.

- (a) NS Pair A and NS Pair B in one section are tied for second on 490 matchpoints. Pair A is second and Pair B is third after their tie is split. Third place in other NS fields are Pair C with 496 and Pair D with 504 matchpoints.

Detail how you will set up the Triangle movement for the last round before lunch and the first round after lunch so that there is no danger of any player in the room hearing discussions during the lunch break about a board s/he is yet to play.
